To those who are looking for traces of their ancestors, the task of finding records of them in places with strange sounding names is a formidable one.


If you have knowledge that your ancestors lived, for even a short time, in one of the lands covered by SGGEE, then our website and society will be of interest.

ST. PETERSBURG EXTRACTIONS

The Volhynian Lutheran St. Petersburg extractions are on the SGGEE website.

Basic data from this huge extraction program is accessible in the public area, but SGGEE members have access to a sophisticated search tool for ancestor births, marriages and deaths.

MASTER PEDIGREE DATABASE

Our Master Pedigree Database is a combination of original research and information from members' pedigrees.

The addition of 165,000 names from birth, marriage and death records in central Poland, combined with the pedigrees from the membership, means the total number of entries exceeds 500,000 names.

The major feature of this database is that family members are linked. If you find one member of a family, you will probably find several other members of the same family.

JOURNAL

A Journal is published quarterly and distributed via the Internet.

The Journal contains society and convention information; articles on political, cultural or family histories; current research projects and other items of interest to members.

FREE LIST SERVICE

SGGEE operates an Internet list service where members and the public can post questions and comments.

ANNUAL CONVENTION

Each year a different city is selected for the SGGEE Annual Convention and Annual General Meeting.

Our conventions feature speakers with a background in genealogy and/or history studies; displays of genealogy/books/maps on computer files or hard copy as available for a venue; searching of the SGGEE databases; and assistance and advice on researching family history or translating records.
